News from the Hill

Bizzy and I attended several briefings from USAFA leadership at the conference to include the Superintendent, Lt Gen Silveria ('85), the Comm, BG Edmondson, the Dean, Col Letendre ('96) and the Athletic Director, Mr. Nathan Pine who was the speaker at our Founder's Day event. Here are some highlights:

- Parent involvement is much higher than it used to be. Assuming you're a
 decade or a few decades removed from the Zoo, think of the most
 parents you could possibly imagine showing up for the Acceptance
 Parade, the one where the new class marches into the wing to become
 Fourth Classmen after BCT. Hold that number in your mind for a minute
 and then compare it to how many showed up this year...4000. I think there
 were 10 at mine, and they were all faculty members.
- 62% of new parents have zero military experience. That's one of the reasons that combining efforts among AOG members, Parent's Clubs and ALOs is so important. There are a lot of talented kids in Southern Arizona who have no idea what options are available to them to attend a service academy. Please look for opportunities to be a mentor!
- 65% of the class of 2019 went to operational career fields, to include 500 pilot slots.
- If you didn't get a chance to look at the chapel last week, you'll have to

wait for up to four years. The good news; when you next see it, the organ will be fully functional for the first time since about 1963 when it started being inundated every time it rained.

- The planetarium is reopened and it's a huge hit. It's a bit like being inside
 a spherical iMax theatre. Shows are free, so definitely stop in when you're
 up there.
- There's plenty more that I'll tell you about over the next couple of months.

I've always been and I'll always be a big fan of Air Force Football. In four days, the Falcons will travel up to Boulder to play the Colorado University Buffaloes and I'm pretty excited.
